**Improvement is based on NCQA national standards tracked since program enrollment. Decreases in hypertension management reflect an influx of new patients receiving this care. Results are expected to increase with continued access to medication for these patients.

COVID-19 Relief

In this unprecedented time of COVID-19 pandemic, the Savings Lives with Medicine Program has been a life-saving force for our clinic partners. In addition to the ongoing support for patients, MAP has provided partner clinics with more than \$20,000* of critical COVID-19 relief supplies in order to protect healthcare staff and enable them to continue meeting the needs of our communities. Many of our clinical partners, such as CCHS, have also been acting as local COVID-19 testing sites.

COVID-19 Relief Supplies Provided: KN95 Masks, Face Masks, Face Shields, Exam Gloves, Personal Care Wipes, Anti-bacterial Foam, Fever Reducers, Cough Suppressants, Infrared Thermometers

During this time of pandemic, many of our clinics have been forced to decrease or stop services. However, each clinic remains committed to serving their patient populations. Many have now reopened to full or partial capacity. Given this, we expect patient-served numbers to increase in the coming months. Additionally, as more than 5 million Americans have lost their health insurance since March 2020 (Source: Families USA), free and charitable clinics across the nation are preparing for increases in the need for their services. The Saving Lives with Medicine Program is poised to meet this increase.
