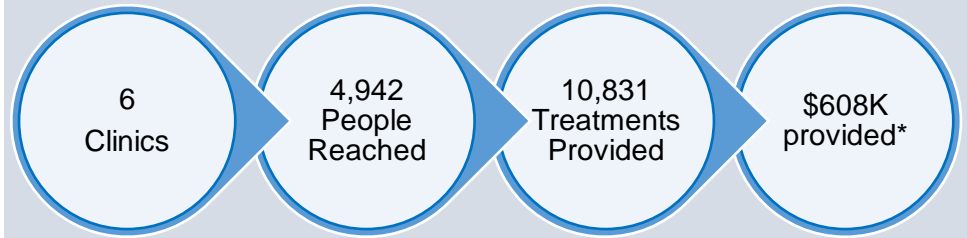


Program Reach

Improving Chronic Disease Management

Patients who benefit from the Saving Lives with Medicines Program demonstrate a clinical improvement in the management of their hypertension, diabetes, high cholesterol, and asthma. In the first three years of the program, more than 50% served in each of these disease categories reported a clinical improvement.

Jan – March 2021 Patient Improvement

Chronic Condition	% of Patients Who Demonstrate Improvement
Hypertension	68%
Diabetes	92%
High Cholesterol	81%
Asthma	92%

COVID-19 Relief Support

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, clinic partners were provided with critical COVID-19 relief supplies. In addition to providing ongoing primary care, many of these clinics are COVID-19 testing and/or vaccination sites.

COVID-19 Relief Supplies Provided This Quarter

- 700 Masks
- 15,140 Gloves
- 1,000 KN95 Masks
- 6 Digital Thermometers
- 2 Infrared Thermometers
- 50 Pairs of Protective Eyewear
- 550 Disposable Protective Gowns

**Improvement is based on NCQA national standards tracked since program enrollment. Decreases in hypertension management reflect an influx of new patients receiving this care. Results are expected to increase with continued access to medication for these patients.
